Pioneering Milestones

- **Mitanin (ASHA) Initiative** — Launched in May 2002 in Chhattisgarh and piloted by SROUT in Korba district, this initiative proved so effective that the Government of India adopted and scaled it nationwide as the ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) programme under the National Health Mission.
- **Pioneers in HIV/AIDS Awareness** — Among the first organisations to initiate HIV/AIDS awareness programmes in Chhattisgarh, significantly contributing to public health education and stigma reduction and continuation of the work more than 20 years.
- **Farmer Producer Organisation (FPO)** — Formed as an outcome of the Watershed Development Programme, comprising 585 members and 2,000+ farmer beneficiaries, operating on a self-sustainable model. NABARD has since partnered with the FPO to fund the Rural Haat Project.
- **25 Years of Development** — 2024 marks a successful 25-year journey of driving transformative development and creating enduring impact across Chhattisgarh.
